## President's Corner – Reunion Time!

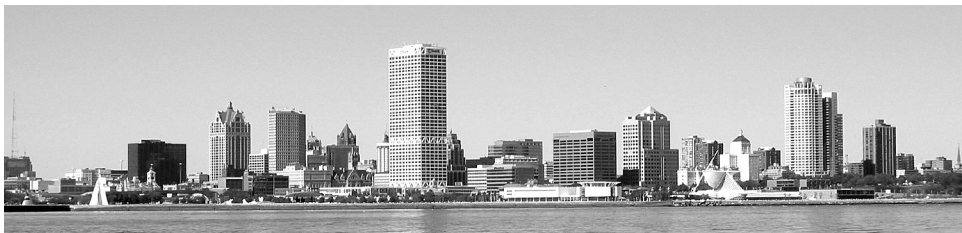

I live in Aitkin Minnesota (sort of the middle of nowhere) and am "retired" so my main activities are fishing and yard work. Greetings Blackhawk Nation,

I hope you are all doing well and looking forward to Christmas and the quickly approaching Opportunity Leave Period. We truly enjoyed having so many of you attend the Squadron Halloween party and Thanksgiving Potluck, these two events were the best attended I have seen. Since the Last newsletter we said farewell to CPT James Lienau as he relinquished command of Cherokee Troop to CPT Arcadio Avalos. James was instrumental in the successful training and deployment of the Troop to Afghanistan. I couldn't be more proud of CPT Lienau's efforts and wish him the very best in his future endeavors.

Please mark your calendars for 14 March 2014. There will be a ceremony to inactivate the Squadron and its Troops, at the conclusion of the ceremony the Squadron's colors and Troop guidons will be sent to Fort Carson, CO where our lineage will continue. Many of our Soldiers will remain in the Brigade past the March inactivation, waiting for their

next assignment or date to leave the Army. Though there are still many more decisions to be made and much more information to be distributed, we do know quite a few things. Firstly, in March and April the Squadron will become a Troop and the Troops will become a platoon. As Troops inactivate, a small inactivation cadre from the inactivating Troop will join B Troop as a subordinated platoon. Those Soldiers remaining will be diligently working to transfer our remaining equipment throughout the Army. A second major point is that due to our fairly rapid inactivation process, many of our training events

Our Soldiers will be spending more time in the motor pool and Squadron's storage facilities to make sure equipment and vehicles are ready to be transferred to new units. As the Squadron's property decreases so will the number of Soldiers assigned to the Squadron.

## **Business Meeting**

*Meeting Date: September 21, 2013*

*Scribe: Jo Lake, appointed Recording Secretary for Meeting by President*

Business meeting was called to order at 5PM with the Pledge of Allegiance. President Tom Fey called on Jerry Barker who welcomed everyone and gave a big thanks to all. VP Lance Lake reported he was just glad to be there.

*Treasurer Tom Schluchter:* Of all the members only a few are paying their dues. We need for everyone to pay dues in order to keep things going. Currently there is \$16,907.01 with the following Account breakdown: Association \$13,762.56, Cavalry Museum \$2,200.00 and Reunion \$928.45. Tom also reported that they have a number of bad addresses on troopers and hopes to get a list in the next bulletin of those so we can update addresses. A motion was made, seconded and passed to put the names in the *Bulletin*. The President, at that time, asked for a motion and a second to approve the Treasurer report, which was received and passed.

*President then addressed Old Business:* Association needs everyone to pay dues.

*New Business:* Motion to accept Secretary Report as printed in newsletter. It was moved and seconded and passed.

The Amendment that was Tabled last business meeting to remove the office of secretary and change it to a Recording Secretary appointed by the President at each Business Meeting was published in the *Blackhawk Bulletin* three times. A motion was made to take from the Table the item concerning the Secretary position was seconded and discussion asked for. No discussion was forthcoming and motion was passed. The Bylaws will be updated.

HHT Troop representative Oscar Olsen was named to replace Lloyd Wirkkala.
