All remaining positions except those of Director shall be appointed by the President, including that of Recording Secretary and Chaplain. The President will also appoint Troop Representatives as recommended by the Troop following their 'election' of one voice to bring troop concerns and news to the annual meeting.

Armed with the above information the Board of Directors will expect that several new names and faces will be seeking election or appointment following Fire Base Barker. It's been a tough fight, sad fight over the past several months; with a few blessing for a number of our Blackhawk families mixed in for good measure.

Our utmost sympathy goes out to Kayleen Vobelt, wife of Rolf Vobelt, on the passing of Rolf following his battles with cancers discovered after their trip to Milwaukee, WI. If you missed the detailed 'sit rep' provided by Kayleen in the last issue of the Bulletin, you may review her comments on line at the Squadron website, www.2-1cavalry.com.

Two very well attended Memorial Services were held honoring Rolf's heroic stand against the diseases that finally liberated his soul; freeing it to join the other Blackhawks at Fiddler's Green. The first was held in Downsville, N.Y. on May 16, 2015; and was presided over by Bill and Ruthanne Loder. Command Sergeant Major (Ret.) Rolf Vobelt described Loder, who he reunited with in B Troop, in Vietnam as Rolf's Platoon Leader; as his "very close friend" and "considered him as his brother". Lt. Col. (Ret.) Loder was able to bring several very personal perspectives to those attending this Memorial Service.

Six days later, on the 22nd of May, a Memorial and internment service was held in Buchanan, MI.; site of the Vobelt's hometown residency following his retirement from the U.S. Army. Full military honors were provided by many of Rolf and Kayleen's friends, to include the rifle salute, flag folding and presentation and the playing of Taps. Among those family members attending were Rolf's son, Ute, his cousin and a family friend; all of them having flown in from Germany for this honorarium. Of the 70-plus persons attending this service, 13 Blackhawks and 10 wives and special guests were present as well. This gathering was presided over by myself and Bill Loder.

On a happier note, however; a July 1st ,2015, date has been scheduled for the return to home of Robert Davis following back surgery in February that left him with a damaged spinal cord, Physical Therapy and the transportation of Bob from Iowa City VA hospital to the Minneapolis VA Hospital. This Wisconsin facility added a full wing on to the existing health care center and is now considered the 'spinal cord injury-specific' place to go by the VA.

Bob is working his way through the steps that may give him some degree of improvement to his legs; maybe even the eventual good riddance of his candy apple red wheelchair. Keep up the fight Bobby! Don't forget how many of us there are out here praying for you and Marie, and anticipating the Firebase Barker reunion we'll have with you. Keep the faith Bro! And remember what the Duke said in that movie.... "I'm gonna move that toe".

On Aug. 11, 1968, Roger and Sharon were united in marriage at the First Lutheran Church in Wiota. Not fond of the big city life, they moved back to Atlantic where he was employed with Camblin Plumbing and Heating for 14 years.

Roger was drafted into the Army in 1969 and served a year in Vietnam. He served with A Troop 1969-1970. He was honorably discharged in 1971 and returned to work at Camblins.

In 1982, he began employment with Cass County Memorial Hospital as an engineer and later became the Director of Plant Operations. In 2013, he was recognized by the Iowa Hospital Association as a Hospital Hero. Roger, along with nine other hospital employees, was chosen from the hospital workers across the state of Iowa to receive this honor. The ceremony to receive this special award was held in Des Moines. Roger is only the second facilities manager to earn this distinction. He took a lot of pride in his work, enjoyed his job, and believed he had the best team of co-workers anyone could ask for. Roger was an avid hunter; he and his son, Matt looked forward every year to hunting. Roger could never sit still; he was always looking for something to repair or cleanup around the house, especially his lawn and vehicles. He enjoyed reading American history and watching the History channel. In 2008, he and Sharon, along with their kids and two grandsons, took a trip to Washington D.C. to view all the war memorials. For him to be able to see the Vietnam Memorial, while there, was truly a bittersweet moment.

Family meant a lot to Roger and he enjoyed attending the grandkid's events. He was a great, easy going guy who loved good conversation with friends and family and was always there to help any of them if they needed him.

He lived along with his parents and two sisters in Marsdorf during WWII, then in Eisendorf. At the age of 15 he and his older sister, Ingrid left Hamburg on the M.S. Italia on 11/3/1953 to come to the United States. They arrived in New York on 11/15/1953. They settled on their uncle's family farm near Central Bridge and Cobleskill, NY.

After turning 18 he joined the U.S. Army out of Albany. He served in the U.S. Army for 30 years. Some of his duty stations were Fort Hood, TX, Erlangen, Germany, Fort Benning, GA,

Schwabach, Germany, Vietnam, Bad Hersfeld, Germany, Fort Carson, CO, Fort Polk, LA, Arng, VT, Schweinfurt and Germany. He retired out of Fort Riley, KS April 1986 as a Command Sergeant Major.
