As I attempt to send out the electronic 2-1 Cavalry Newsletter "Keeping in Touch", I keep having numbers of email rejections, even from some email addresses that were previously successful. This invariably has to do with spam filters, either locally on your personally owned computers or filters associated with your internet provider. Both can usually be overcome with what they call a "Whitelist." A Whitelist is a way for users to tell their spam filter to accept an email, even if the filter thinks it is spam. Your internet provider or whoever you use for email can probably help you with this. The email address to whitelist is **admin@2-1cavalry.com**. This is the address we use. The email addresses that were rejected are listed. If yours is one of these and it is no longer valid, please send me your new address. If the address is still valid, see if you can whitelist it or if unsuccessful, perhaps you have another different email address you can send me to use. The rejected addresses are:
